Georgia Power modifies drawdown schedule for lakes

Due to low inflows and operational maintenance being performed on Georgia Power's North Georgia lakes, the drawdown schedule for lakes Burton, Rabun, Seed and Tallulah Falls have been modified to accommodate these needed repairs.

The revised drawdown schedule is:

Lake Burton

- Drawdown begins Oct. 18, 2010
- Take down 8 feet below normal operating level by Dec. 31, 2010 (1857.0 feet)
- Start refill on Feb. 1, 2011
- Lake level within 5 feet of normal operating level by March 1, 2011
- Lake at normal operating level by May 1, 2011

Lake Rabun

- Drawdown begins Nov. 29, 2010
- Take down 8 feet below normal operating by Dec. 3, 2010 (1879.5 feet)
- Start refill on Dec. 20, 2010
- Lake at normal operating level by Dec. 25, 2010

Lake Seed (Nacoochee)

- Drawdown begins Jan. 3, 2011
- Take down 12 feet below normal operating level by Jan. 9, 2011 (1739.0)
- Start refill on Feb. 1, 2011
- Lake at normal operating level by Feb. 12, 2011

Tallulah Falls Lake is currently down eight feet due to maintenance repairs. No drawdown is scheduled for Lake Yonah.

During the drawdowns, fluctuations may occur on a daily basis due to generation demand, rainfall or other events. For more information or questions about the drawdown schedule, please contact Georgia Power's Land Management Office at 706-782-4014.
